## ELECTRONIC BOOKS AT THE GRADUATE CENTER

**WHAT ELECTRONIC BOOKS ARE AVAILABLE?:** The Mina Rees Library has rights to thousands of books in all disciplines in several collections. Go to the library's **Databases** page for descriptions of **Black Thought and Culture**, **Cambridge Histories Online**, **Digital Dissertations**, **Early English Books Online (EBBO)**, **EBSCO eBook Collection (formerly NetLibrary)**, **ebrary**, **Eighteenth Century Collection Online (ECCO)**, **Gale Virtual Reference Library**, **Grolier Reference Online**, **Handbooks in Economics Series**, **Literature Resources from Gale**, **Making of the Modern World**, **Oxford Language Dictionaries Online**, **Oxford Reference Online**, **Oxford Scholarship Online**, **Palgrave Connect**, **PsycBooks**, **Twayne's Author Series**, **Women and Social Movements in the United States, 1600-2000**, and **Women and Social Movements International, 1840 to Present**.

**ACCESSING ELECTRONIC BOOKS:** In addition to accessing electronic books directly from the collections above, many, but not all, available titles may be found in the CUNY Catalog of the holdings of all CUNY libraries. **Only when Graduate Center or CUNY appears as a location beside Electronic Resource in the catalog is the title available to Graduate Center students, faculty, and staff.** The Graduate School of Journalism is not the Graduate Center. If rights to an electronic book are held by CUNY libraries other than the Graduate Center, you must view these books at the libraries owning these rights or make an interlibrary-loan request ([gc.cuny.illiad.oclc.org/illiad/logon.html](http://gc.cuny.illiad.oclc.org/illiad/logon.html)) for a print copy. Electronic books may not be borrowed through interlibrary-loan or CLICS ([library.gc.cuny.edu/using-the-library/borrowing-and-access/interlibrary-loanill-and-clics](http://library.gc.cuny.edu/using-the-library/borrowing-and-access/interlibrary-loanill-and-clics)).

All available electronic resources may be accessed using your Graduate Center computer network/email login. Complete remote access details are explained at [library.gc.cuny.edu/using-the-library/remote-access](http://library.gc.cuny.edu/using-the-library/remote-access).

If you are unable to access an electronic book through the CUNY Catalog, add the Graduate Center's proxy-server prefix to the book's URL:

**SEARCHING TIPS:** In addition to searching for electronic books by author and title, find them by using **Command Search** in the CUNY Catalog. Including **wow=gc and wfm=bk and wpd=c** limits the result to electronic books available to Graduate Center patrons. This search can be combined with subjects (**wsu=**) and keywords (**wrd=**). If your search term is not a Library of Congress subject heading (economics, not economic theory, motion pictures, not movies, etc.), use wrd=: wow=gc and wsu=film noir and wfm=bk and wpd=c; wow=gc and wrd=audiology and wfm=bk and wpd=c.

**REQUEST PURCHASE OF ELECTRONIC BOOKS:** If you find an electronic book you want the Graduate Center to purchase, use the form at [library.gc.cuny.edu/help/request-forms/new-book](http://library.gc.cuny.edu/help/request-forms/new-book). If this title meets the requirements of the library's collection-development policy ([library.gc.cuny.edu/about-the-library/collections/collection-policies-2](http://library.gc.cuny.edu/about-the-library/collections/collection-policies-2)), it may be purchased through the Student Technology Fee, if funds are available.

**VIEWING, SAVING, AND PRINTING:** Many vendors of electronic books allow viewing, saving, or printing only a page at a time. Emailing is not usually allowed.

**DOWNLOADING TO DEVICES:** More and more vendors are allowing their electronic books to be downloaded to devices. The EBSCO eBook Collection can be read on some mobile devices. Doing so requires creating a free My EBSCOhost account. Go to [support.ebsco.com/ebooks](http://support.ebsco.com/ebooks) for more details. Electronic books from ebrary may be downloaded to many mobile devices, including iPad and Nook, but not Kindle. Transferring electronic books from your computer to your mobile device requires installing Adobe Digital Editions on your computer. A free download of this software is available at [www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/#fp](http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/#fp). Project Gutenberg offers 36,000 free titles that can be downloaded to Android, iPad, Kindle, Nook, and other devices. **USING EBRARY:** CUNY's largest electronic-book collection is **ebrary**, offering 68,000 scholarly books in all disciplines. In addition to finding these books through author, title, subject, and keyword searches in the CUNY Catalog, it may be beneficial to browse **ebrary** directly to see what types of books are available. Titles may be browsed by such broad categories as anthropology, fine arts, history, language and literature, etc. Using the **advanced search** and the **text and key fields** option will find books in more specific subjects.

Select the **Sign In** button to create an **ebrary** account so that you can place selected titles in a **Bookshelf**. Select **My Settings** to manage exporting records to **EndNote** or **RefWorks**. Many other electronic-book collections, such as **EBSCO eBook Collection**, have similar functions.

Browsing EBSCO eBook Collection and Oxford Scholarship Online may also be useful. Search results in Oxford Scholarship Online will include electronic books to which the Graduate Center does not have access, indicated by a lock icon.
