Finding Ph.D. Dissertations and Master's Theses

Digital Dissertations

- From the URL above, select Databases and then Digital Dissertations.
- CUNY Ph.D. dissertations from 1997, as well as those from other American universities, are available in Digital Dissertations, and an increasing number from earlier years are also available. CUNY Ph.D. dissertations from 1965 to the present are indexed in Digital Dissertations.
- Search for CUNY dissertations by using **0046** as the school code.
- Order unavailable dissertations, usually on microfilm, via interlibrary loan, or purchase them through Digital Dissertations.
- Find additional non-US dissertations at **ethos.bl.uk/Home.do** and **www-apps.crl.edu/catalog/dissertationSearch.asp**. Many additional sources of dissertations and information about dissertations may be found at **libguides.gc.cuny.edu/content.php?pid=231531&sid=1915677**.

CUNY Ph.D. Dissertations in Hard Copy

- Reading copies of all CUNY dissertations are shelved in the first floor Dissertation Reading Room, 2001-present, or in the reference area on the second floor, 1965-2000. Master's theses may be found in shelves across from the circulation/reserve desk on the first floor.
- Dissertations are color-coded by department and shelved chronologically and then by author within each year. Microfilm copies are also available.
- Cataloging of CUNY dissertations is underway in the CUNY Catalog and WorldCat. Most but not all have been cataloged.
- Find dissertations in the CUNY Catalog by author or title and, in some cases, subject.
- Find dissertations for a particular year by selecting Call number as your search type and then entering Thesis followed by the year: Thesis 2002.

CUNY Master's Theses in Hard Copy

- CUNY Master's theses may be found only in the CUNY Catalog.
- To search by program in the CUNY Catalog, do an author search for **City University of New York Masters program in [program name]**.
